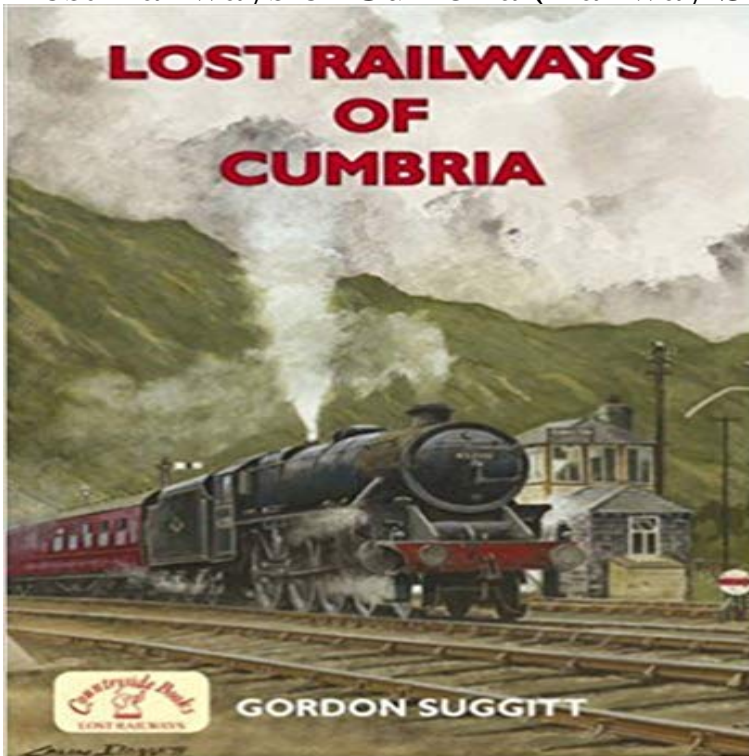


Lost Railways of Cumbria (Railway Series)

Sadly the railway age was not to last, local demand was simply not enough to keep many of the lines in operation and the services were doomed. Happily, some lines have been preserved by enthusiastic societies and reopened sections of track flourish. This well written and excellently researched book brings to life the history of Cumbrias railways. With photographs and specially drawn maps.
