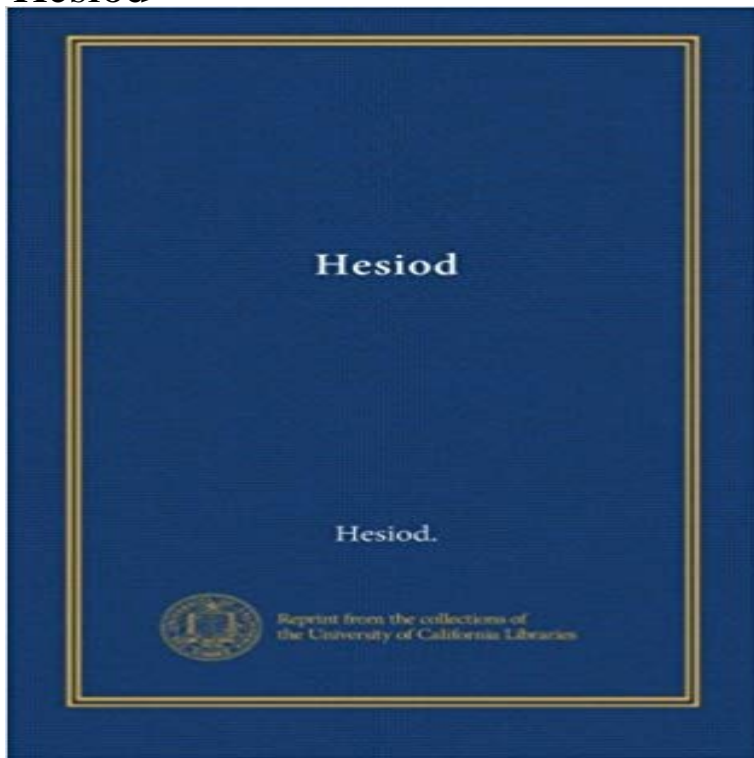


Hesiod
