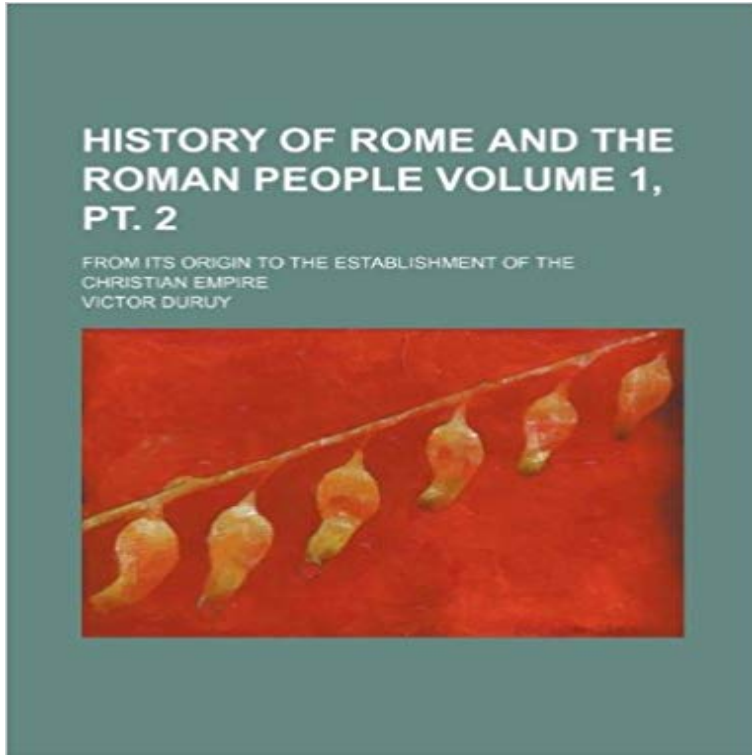

ROME and Carthage had known each other for a long time; three times they had sealed their alliance by treaties, for they had the same enemies--the pirates who infested the Tyrrhenian Sea, and pillaged the coasts of Latium; later on the Italiot Greeks and Pyrrhus. We can still quote these monuments of a very ancient diplomacy: Polybius had read them on tables of bronze preserved in the archives of the a?diles. They are doubly interesting--as regards the history of political events, and that of the law of nations. The most ancient, which is at once a treaty of alliance and of commerce, was negotiated by Tarquin, and concluded by the first consuls of the republic (509). Between the Romans and their allies on the one part, the Carthaginians and their allies on the other, there shall be peace and amity on the following conditions: the Romans and their allies shall not sail their war-ships beyond east of Cape Bon (Prom. Pulchrum), unless
